

Market and Industry Analyst

The Canadian Poultry and Egg Processors (CPEP) is the national trade organization representing the interests of more than 170 Canadian poultry processing, egg grading and processing and hatchery establishments. Representing some of the largest agri-food producers in Canada, our member companies process over 90% of Canada's chicken, turkey, eggs and hatching eggs. CPEP's team of six professionals is based in Ottawa.

The Market and Industry Analyst is responsible for collecting, recording, analyzing and presenting data on production, imports, storage, exports and sales of Canadian poultry and egg products for use by the association's leadership, sector managers, member representatives and the Association of Ontario Chicken Processors (AOCP) in their interactions with producers and government.

The position's responsibilities include the following:

- Compiling, updating, analyzing and reporting data in key areas such as:
 - Imports, storage stocks, exports, supply, and consumption/disappearance for poultry and egg products.
 - Producer price calculations for poultry products.
 - Wholesale and retail prices, margins.
- The analyst will provide strategic information relevant to poultry and egg products to support the management of CPEP and AOCP such as:
 - Economic analysis to support policy and advocacy initiatives.

Qualifications:

The ideal candidate has the following skills, knowledge and experience:

- Undergraduate or college degree, preferably in economics, agricultural economics, business management or another area of study involving statistical/quantitative analysis.
- Proficiency using Microsoft Office suite (Excel, Word and PowerPoint).
- Demonstrated ability to collect, organize, analyze and present data through charts and other presentation formats.
- Ability to work in a collaborative environment as a team player.
- Relationship management skills, including effective inter-personal communications.
- Experience serving customers (internal and/or external).
- Strong writing skills would be an asset.
